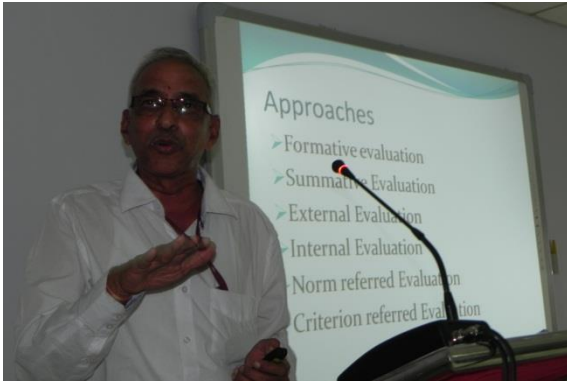

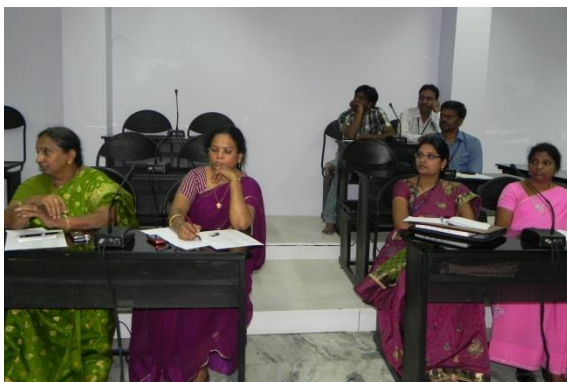

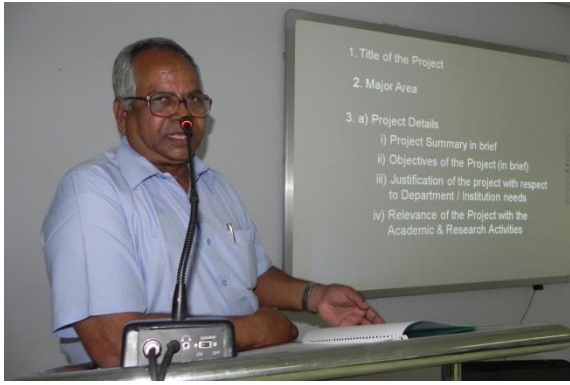

15th & 16th MARCH 2013

A Faculty Development Program on “**Promoting Excellence in Teaching**” is organised by IQAC for two days i.e., on 15th & 16th March 2013. The Resource persons for this program are **M.C. Das, Professor and Management Consultant & HRD Trainer** and **Dr. B. E. V. V. N. Murthy, Retd. Prof & Dean, SCM & IS, Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati**. They inspired the audience for two days with their vast knowledge.

They addressed the participants in the following manner:

High Education institutions have already realized that new trends, demands and developments in this sector require a shift in the quality culture and improvement in learning and teaching. Thus colleges must respond to market requirements, globalization, increased student numbers, funding constraints and calls for greater accountability. These have necessitated increased harmonization and mobility at international level whilst aiming to safeguard standards, improve quality, support diversity and increase transferability and compatibility. Every college and the entire faculty must facilitate these goals and promote quality assurance, including a focus on quality teaching.

Traditionally, good teaching has meant teacher-centered instruction, a focus on knowledge memorization and student responsibility for their own learning. This is the widespread view that “a college is an institution that exists to provide instruction.”

They concluded that staff is actively trying to use strategies that they consider to be excellent, to evaluate their practice and consider wider issues related to approaches in other subjects as well. They appreciated the discussion done with the faculty as a positive opportunity for reflection. However, they told that staff should still focus on professional standards and knowledge of subject as specific features.
